

FROM THE NEWS DESK

There's something special about standing in the presence of history.

Australia has a rich and varied motoring past and as soon as cars hit our shores adventurers were quick to see what they could achieve using the self-propelled machines.

It was not an easy task with our roads either thick with choking dust or boggy rutted tracks torn up by horse and buggy.



In 1908 two men set out to achieve the impossible, to cross Australia from south to north, from Adelaide to Darwin, in a 25hp Talbot.

They had no need to worry about dusty or muddy tracks. There were none. They would make their own. Harry Dutton and Murray Aunger would make history and while these motoring pioneers are long gone, the car they used (and abused) is alive and well. It now lives at the National Motor Museum at Birdwood in the Adelaide Hills. That the car still exists is a miracle, with most cars from this era having succumbed to rust or wood rot in back paddocks.

On August 20, 1908, when Dutton and Aunger drove into Darwin, they had made history as the first people to drive across the Australian continent. They had set out on their journey 51 days earlier on June 30 from Adelaide. Many doubted the travellers would be successful as their first attempt in 1907 ran into the wet season and the car had to be abandoned.

For many people living in remote areas, it was the first time they had seen a vehicle that could travel under its own power. Some people today thick it's a tough trip, I don't think so.

Ages ago John G and I watched a senior member of the club erect his newly acquired pop-top caravan. This was before the surge in popularity of the off-road camper trailer. I said to John "That's what you have to look forward to when you get old".

Well, there's been a lot of water under the bridge since then. So guess what! I've bought a camper, a tent on a trailer. I guess it's gone the full circle and I've got old. John didn't laugh when I told him what I've done, either.

Seems I'm a bit of a trend setter too! Someone else in the club is unloading their old Toyota and has bought a Jeep Cherokee XJ. Not only that but he's building a camper trailer as well.

Hello campers,

Have just confirmed a booking at Camden Haven airfield on October long weekend. Arrive from Thursday PM. Lazy weekend with nothing definite planned (yet) will try and gather together some suggestions for your entertainment. You can have a look at the pretty pictures athttp://www.skycam.com.au/YCMH/

Especially take note of the picture of the round table in the centre. Click on this to see the distance from the camping area to the showers/crapper. Also note the no frills crapper photo. This is at the camping area on the river next to the runway. Only bring bikes for the kids you no longer love and only bring along dogs that are going to expire soon anyway.

There are two cabins for rent with a double and two singles in each. They are next to the facilities. \$33/night for one plus \$11/person extra. I.e. 2=\$44 3=\$55 4=\$66 with a continental breakfast. I will leave it to you to ring Bob on the number on the website if you want a cabin.

Camping fee \$5 / night / person. Forgot to ask about firewood but will probably have to byo for the quantities we will use! I will check. Access to boat ramp and river next to camp. Also have a look at http://www.oldbarbeachfestival.com.au/ www.oldbarbeachfestival.com.au for something to do if you aren't fline or 4wding. In googlemaps.com type in "rossglen" and you will see the strip just to the east. Will need numbers eventually but as it is all byo, there is no urgency – say by Sept 20th to give the owners fair warning. Updates as I hear of them. Ring or email with any dumb questions.
