FROM THE NEWS DESK

WORKSHOP WEEKEND Waz'n Laz

When Penny's Wrangler came from Chrysler it was shod with 225/75 X 15 tyres and had 3.73:1 diff ratios. During the build-up to "Magoo" we fitted bigger 31 X 10.5R 15 tyres. Whilst the Wrangler then had a tougher appearance, it's on-road performance suffered as a result of the bigger tyres. It had to be driven at wider throttle openings and it lost momentum on the slightest of inclines. This resulted in the vehicle being thirstier than Boris Yeltsin. The Speedo was reading slow, and some driveline vibration had developed because of the lifted suspension.

The jump in fuel prices last year prompted Beth to make the comment that Mum's Jeep was more economical when it had smaller tyres. I took this statement on board and "surfed the net", checking Jeep engine power curves, and comparing different diff ratios and tyre sizes. Based on what I found out I made the decision to change the diff ratios. Not a huge change, but enough to restore the Jeep's performance to factory specs.

When I was talking with Warren he mentioned that he also had diff work to be done on some of his fleet. Jeep diffs are unique and fiddly to set up. The work needs to be done by someone with experience, patience and know-how. And it helps if they don't want to get rich on one job, too. So we asked around and a guy from Western Australia was highly recommended. It so happened that he was coming to the East Coast for a holiday in January '08. So we put it to him to come to Krambach for a few days and we'd guarantee a heap of work. Arrangements were finalised for 19th & 20th January, so I loaded up "Magoo" on Friday arvo and headed north for the weekend.

Warren had two diffs operated on. He wanted to do more but all his bits didn't arrive from the States in time. After I had my ratio changes carried out, and whilst the Jeep was in open-heart surgery mode, a slip-yolk eliminator was installed in the transfer case. This is regulation stuff for a Wrangler operated in an environment any tougher than the Council nature strip. Check out the difference between shafts in the photo.







My return trip from Krambach showed immediate benefits. The Wrangler was easier to drive, responding crisply to throttle input, and maintaining speed on the Bulahdelah Hills. It was noticeably less thirsty, and the driveline vibrations had disappeared.

TRIP REPORT

EXPLORING COFFS- NOT

We had planned on showing the non Jeep owners in the club the tracks around the Coffs Harbour area. As you all know it's been a bit damp lately. A week before the trip, discussion had turned to whether it was worth driving the extra distance only to be restricted by the conditions.

Ray riding solo and Ken with Brett as navi arrived at the Krambach half way house on Thursday. By this stage it had been decided not to venture too much further north, the weather had dampened spirits. So plan B was established. This involved sampling the tracks around Possum Brush near our dry accommodation. Lindsey was to meet up with us later. The small group was given a scenic tour of the district on the way to the first 4wding area, to test the waters so to speak.

The skies were grey but no rain yet. The round about tour must have disorientated some of the group a little. I knew exactly where I was, as Ray had stuck his new GPS to my windscreen. After a trackside smoko we headed off to test a track I wanted to sample in the damp conditions. No problems with that one so we went in search of a greater challenge.

A quick run up the highway took us to a favourite ascent of mine that we had done twelve months earlier. In the dry, this is a short steep climb, with loose gibbers at the bottom. It's the same in the wet but just a little more slippery. The steepness of the track would give us a good indication of track conditions anywhere we chose to go on the coast. A diversion hump half way up caused a bit of trouble for the CJ8, but with some perseverance I made it. I walked down to offer some guidance to the others, but doubt had crept into their minds. The disorientated feelings must have muddled their thought processes. We yelled opinions on what to do, and I mistakenly said, the only other option was to go back the way they came. I heard engines fire in the distance and then the sounds got further away. That's odd I thought, they should be getting louder. Then I realised the chicken route had been taken.

A stop for lunch and I mentioned how Mike had driven up the same hill in the Prado twelve months earlier. We've never been here before was the reply form all three. Three against one made them feel they were right, I know they are wrong. So it was off to sample the slippery conditions on another track we had done previously in the dry. I thought this would sort us out and it did. I gave it a fair crack, even resorting to airing down the tyres but to no avail. It was suggested Kens tyres might have some more bite, they didn't. Then it poured, and we all got a bit wet trying to recover Ken. We put our tails between our legs, defeated by the weather, and headed for our dry accommodation.

Plan C was evolving, as we checked the weather conditions on the BOM web site. It was decided heading west was the best option. We toured around with our limited maps aided by Rays GPS. I had jumped into the Cherokee for the remainder of the trip and would you believe, it was overheating. The sun had come out and it was quite steamy at times.

We travelled through storms, stopped plenty to let the Jeep cool down, and found a good camp site for the night. The next day saw the showers disappear. The Jeep still overheated. We got a bit lost. We stopped plenty of times to let the Jeep cool and saw some new country to the west off Thunderbolts way. Ray took us to a camp site he knew of by the Dilgry River near Barrington tops. Most of what we had done in the last two days was all new to us and provided enough to warrant a return visit some time.

Monday morning was sunny but Brett and Ken decided to head for home. Ray and I took the scenic route back to Krambach and nearly got lost a couple more times. Again some new country was covered, unfortunately though we had been two and a half days without mobile service and were unable to let Lindsey know where we were.
