UHF CHANNELS - WHO USES WHAT

UHF radios are limited to 5 Watt output by law for unlicensed users. Anything higher is deemed commercial and should only be used by obtaining a licence from the Australian Communications and Media Authority (ACMA).

UHF BAND:-

Channels 5 & 35 - EMERGENCY USE ONLY

Channel 11 - Calling

Channel 22 & 23 - Data only (No Voice)

Channel 40 – Recommended Road Channel (not allocated) Channels 9, 10, 12 – 21, 24 – 30,, 39 General chit chat.

HF BAND :-

Channel 8 - Recommended Road Channel (not allocated)

Channel 9 - EMERGENCY USE ONLY Channel 11 - Calling (AM model) Channel 16 - Calling (LSB model)

REPEATER STATIONS (DUPLEX)

Repeater station is a station that picks up a radio signal and relays it a further distance than would otherwise be possible, provided the sender is in range of a repeater station.

Duplex works by using two UHF Channels to relay the single radio signal. Channels 1 – 8 are directly linked to Channels 31 – 38. Transmitting on Channel 1 is received by Channel 31, Channel 2 is received on Channel 32 etc.

SUNNY CORNER PINZGAUER SHAKEDOWN

Eager participants: Greg - Cherokee, Rod - Jeep J10, Warren - Cherokee, Ray - Landcruiser and me in newly acquired Pinzgauer.

Having owned the Pinz for a couple of months and not been able to get it seriously off road had been frustrating and I had been looking forward to testing out its legendary off road ability. It had been completely straight and undamaged since 1975 and it was time to do something about it! Truth is that I was terrified of damaging my new toy.

After attending Angus Stewarts wedding on the Central Coast and leaving the clubs northern brothers to wallow in an alcoholic stupor I arrived home at midnight. The weather forecasts all week had been for rain showers but 5am on Saturday and all was looking well.



On Friday I had proudly completed a small modification on the Pinz which allowed the right wiper to sweep more of the screen and let me see the right mirror in the rain. (Dopey Austrians built the thing so you had NO vision to the right in the rain!) Anyway, on with the main tale.

We were to try a new access into Mt Walker and blundered around a bit looking for the way in. During said blundering the J10 was refusing to proceed. Oh well – at least his wipers work! I went ahead along the power lines and found a particularly nice new gate and no entry sign. OK, plan B. On the way back to the highway we found a knowledgeable looking local who explained the gate and gave intricate directions to the next entry up the road. We eventually got to the property we were looking for (a large farm vacuumed up by the green cancer) and once established on the main track proceeded to the river.
