Hi Presidents,

As you will be aware the next meeting of the Association will be on Saturday, 17 November in Quirindi, which is approximately 60 klms South of Tamworth. The meeting will be hosted by the Tamworth 4WD Club. However, this will be a meeting with a difference for 2 reasons, one it is an opportunity to support our country clubs and indirectly farmers and farm communities that are struggling at the moment and two, it is our AGM. The Hunter Region has arranged a special event on that weekend at a town called Wallabadah. There will be an opportunity to support their community effort as well.

I would like to encourage you to organise attendance at the General Meeting as part of a Club trip. I believe it would be a very interesting weekend for your Club.

The Association meeting meeting will be on the Saturday and there is the opportunity to combine that with other activities. The meeting will start at 9.30am and will be held in the Quirindi Uniting Church Hall in Pryor Street.
